## Waste to Wonders: Activating Community Recycling

Yayasan JCorp's "Waste to Wonders" initiative championed environmental care, collecting an impressive five tonnes of recyclables. Held on 9 February 2025 at B5 Johor Street Market, this collaborative effort with Johor Bahru City Council and SWM Environment highlighted the strength of partnerships for environmental good. The sheer volume of paper, plastic, aluminium, electronics, fabrics, and cooking oil collected demonstrated strong community engagement when provided with the means to recycle. By accepting such a wide array of materials, the initiative made it convenient for residents to participate, further contributing to the impressive collection total.

Beyond the immediate success of the collection drive, the programme also served to raise crucial awareness about the importance of recycling within the local community. Furthermore, it effectively promoted the Yayasan JCorp Recycling Centre which has been

operational since November 2023. This indicates a long-term strategy by Yayasan JCorp to not only conduct impactful recycling events but also to establish and promote permanent recycling infrastructure within the community. The event served as a visible demonstration of the foundation's ongoing commitment to environmental sustainability.

Engaging activities like donation drives, a book exchange, an energetic Pound Fit session, and a colouring competition further encouraged participation.

The involvement of Johor Bahru City Council and SWM Environment, as well as students from both local and international educational institutions highlights Yayasan JCorp's ability to engage with a diverse range of stakeholders in its community initiatives. This collaboration not only contributed to the programme's immediate success but also fostered a sense of civic responsibility among all participants.

# Refining our Tuition Project for Enhanced Learning

Yayasan JCorp, in its ongoing commitment to educational advancement, hosted an intensive Tuition Project Refinement Module from 17 to 19 March 2025. This collaborative initiative with Jabatan Pendidikan Negeri Johor (JPNJ) took place at the scenic Sungai Johor Eco Retreat in Kota Tinggi. The choice of location likely provided a conducive environment for focused work and collaboration. This valuable session brought together 25 experienced English teachers to collaboratively enhance learning materials. The module specifically focused on improving English proficiency among students through targeted activities in essay writing, grammar drills, and conversational practice. This concentrated approach aimed to equip educators with refined tools and techniques to better support their students' language development.

The focused curriculum on essay writing, grammar, and conversation indicates a targeted approach to improving specific and crucial aspects of English language learning. Furthermore, the emphasis on aligning the module with SPM requirements demonstrates a practical and results-oriented approach, directly addressing the academic needs and goals of students.

# Workshop for the Development of a Reporting System for Akademi Dalam Industri



In a parallel effort to enhance educational efficiency, Yayasan JCorp also conducted a crucial workshop focused on the development of a comprehensive Reporting System for Akademi Dalam Industri (ADi). This vital initiative is specifically designed to significantly streamline data reporting processes for students, teachers, and industries involved in the ADi programme. The development of such a system reflects a commitment to leveraging technology to improve educational administration and outcomes.

Developed through the expertise of professionals from JPNJ, this innovative system aims to enhance efficiency by automating and simplifying data entry and retrieval. It also seeks to improve data accessibility for all relevant stakeholders, ensuring transparency and informed decision-making. Furthermore, the system aims to standardise data entry through the use of predefined templates, which will not only save time but also improve the quality and consistency of the reported information. Ultimately, this initiative aims to contribute to a more effective and transparent educational experience for everyone involved in the ADi programme.



## Programme Objectives

To develop an integrated reporting system that allows seamless access to ADi programme data.

To provide a structured platform for data entry using predefined templates.

To reduce the time taken for report compilation and dissemination.

To ensure transparency and accessibility of reports for all stakeholders.

## Programme Impact

**10** educational experts collaboratively designed the framework for the ADi Reporting System during the workshop.

A functional prototype of the ADi Reporting System was successfully developed to support data management and monitoring.

**1** centralised platform introduced for submitting and retrieving reports by teachers, industry mentors, and administrators.

Since 2023, a total of **64** students have benefited from ADi apprenticeship.

The ADi programme celebrated significant success as all 21 apprentices from Cohort 1 passed SPM and 22 obtained the MPAK certificate. One student achieved straight A's in the SPM, while 22 apprentices successfully received SKM 2 & 3 certificates through this programme.



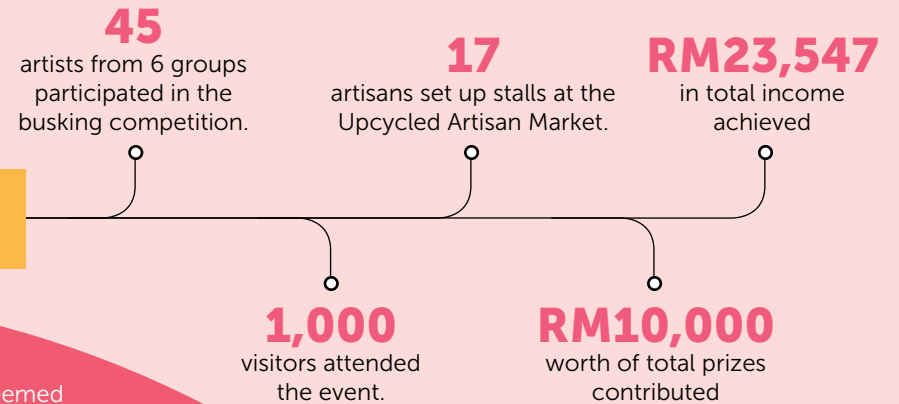

This competition served as a significant boost to the local arts platform, especially in anticipation of Visit Johor Year 2026, highlighting the region's vibrant cultural landscape.

In addition to the thrilling busking competition, the Pentas Seni Johor featured an engaging Upcycled Artisan Market and an innovative Artchemy workshop, offering participants a unique opportunity to learn transformative art techniques that turn used materials into valuable works of art. The integration of these events demonstrated a creative and holistic approach to promoting both the arts and environmental sustainability. The impressive attendance figures highlight the programme's success in engaging a large and diverse segment of the community.

# Safeguarding Kain Benang Johor Tradition

Initiated by Yayasan JCorp in collaboration with Yayasan Warisan Johor, this initiative aims to preserve and strengthen the legacy of traditional weaving in Johor through three complementary pillars. The first pillar, Infrastructure and Equipment Improvement, focuses on providing five traditional weaving looms (kek) and a preliminary processing machine to ensure continuous and effective production of Kain Benang Johor.

The second pillar, Human Capital Empowerment, is dedicated to nurturing local talent by offering basic weaving training to Johorean youth and persons with disabilities. Additionally, five outstanding individuals will be selected and sponsored to further their studies in weaving at the National Craft Institute (IKN), ensuring the future of Johor's artistic heritage.

The third pillar, Promotion and Awareness, aims to increase public appreciation and elevate the cultural prestige of Kain Benang Johor. Through active promotional efforts and strategic collaborations, the initiative seeks to expand the reach of Kain Benang Johor to new audiences and markets, ensuring its continued relevance and growth. Together, these efforts will ensure that the tradition of Kain Benang Johor thrives for generations to come.

Financial support was also provided to the programme, further encouraging innovation and the creation of new products based on this traditional textile. The foundation is also actively supporting the implementation of innovative programmes based on woven products, fostering creativity and economic opportunities within the community.

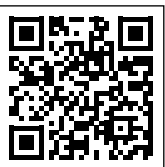

Driven by its fundamental mission to improve community health and actively promote sustainability, KPJ Puteri Specialist Hospital consistently engages in impactful corporate social responsibility programmes to ensure that individuals within the community have access to essential healthcare services and the vital knowledge required to lead healthier lives. These proactive efforts have effectively created greater awareness within the community about the critical importance of early detection of health issues, the benefits of adopting healthier lifestyle changes, and the overall advantages of preventive care.

A key ongoing initiative is the JB Car-Free Morning community event held in front of the MBJB Office every second Sunday of the month for the last three consecutive years. **Hosted a productive courtesy visit from Yang Berhormat Tuan Aznan bin Tamin, Chairman of the Johor State Education and Information Committee.** The discussions, led by Yayasan JCorp's CEO Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman, centred on potential strategic collaborations aimed at enhancing various educational initiatives within the state of Johor. A particular emphasis was placed on the promotion of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) education, aligning with the priorities outlined in the Johor Budget 2025. Tuan Haji Mohd Kamal Ahmad Untong, Deputy Director of the Student Development Sector at the Johor State Education Department (JPNJ), also participated in this important meeting. Through this comprehensive programme, each participant also received targeted training to prepare them for Public Speaking, Poetry Recitation, and Storytelling competitions. This significant initiative was organised by the Student Talent Development Unit, Student Development Sector, Johor State Education Department. This early investment in language education underscores Yayasan JCorp's commitment to fostering academic excellence and providing students with essential skills for future success.



**The impactful "Waste to Wonders" programme was held at B5 Johor Street Market, Johor Bahru.** The event featured a diverse range of activities designed to promote recycling and environmental awareness within the community. **Extending its reach beyond Johor, Yayasan JCorp actively engaged in a CSR programme in Kuala Lumpur, providing support to 100 homeless people and underprivileged groups in Lorong Haji Taib, Chow Kit.** This initiative, known as Bantu Seeni Bersama Abbe Hae, demonstrates Yayasan JCorp's broader commitment to social responsibility and its willingness to assist vulnerable communities in different parts of the country.
