NURTURING STRONGER ROOTS FOR A GREENER TOMORROW

On 30 May 2025, a powerful stride towards environmental restoration was made as Johor Plantations Group (JPG), in collaboration with Yayasan JCorp, Waqaf An-Nur, and Pertubuhan Sahabat Hutan Bakau Pulau Tanjung Surat (PSHBTS), successfully planted 2,000 mangrove trees at Pulau Tanjung Surat, Kota Tinggi, Johor. Mangrove forests are the unsung heroes of our coastlines, acting as crucial natural barriers against erosion, nurturing a rich tapestry of marine life, and playing a significant role in carbon sequestration. By protecting and expanding these vital habitats, we are not only safeguarding our environment but also enhancing the resilience of our coastal communities.

This collective effort, which doubled the impact of the preceding year's initiative, stands as a clear demonstration of Johor's unwavering commitment to biodiversity and long-term environmental sustainability.

It forms a vital part of JPG's ambitious One Million Roots for the Future (1MRFF) campaign, which boldly aims to plant over one million trees to restore and protect our precious coastal ecosystems and the life they sustain, playing a vital role in safeguarding the state's coastal ecosystems and nurturing a greener, greater era for Johor to come.

At the same time, Yayasan JCorp also contributed an Interactive Smartboard worth RM11,000 to SK Tanjung Surat to enhance digital learning opportunities and avenues for the students. The event was graced by the presence of esteemed dignitaries, including Tuan Haji Mohd Hanafi bin Samad, Director of the Johor State Education Department, YB Tuan Aznan bin Tamin, Johor State Executive Councillor and ADUN Tanjung Surat, among other key leaders from the Johor State Education Department, Waqaf An-Nur, and JPG.

SMART GROWTH: CULTIVATING SUSTAINABLE SCHOOLS THROUGH STEM

Yayasan JCorp is actively cultivating the future of agriculture by empowering young minds through its 'Sustainable School - STEM' Programme. In a significant step forward, Smart Greenhouses were provided to SMK Seri Medan, Batu Pahat, and SMK Buloh Kasap, Segamat, as part of this innovative initiative, conducted in collaboration with the Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor. The development of these cutting-edge facilities is now fully completed, equipping both schools with the capacity to achieve healthier, consistent yields all year round, while also cultivating a sustainable means of food production.

To ensure the optimal use of these facilities, which leverage advanced Internet of Things (IoT) systems, a Seed Germination Training Session was held on 15 and 22 May 2025. Conducted by Urban Farm Tech, the appointed greenhouse supplier, these sessions provided participating teachers and students with crucial insights into smart agriculture and the practical techniques required to cultivate a thriving greenhouse environment. This hands-on training is vital in bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world application, inspiring the next generation of agri-tech innovators.

- Increase teachers' and students' knowledge regarding smart agriculture concepts.
- Provide teachers and students with practical exposure to innovative seed germination and crop management techniques.
- Support STEM education initiatives in schools by integrating science, technology, engineering, and mathematics elements in activities outside the classroom.

20,000 visitors flooded KotaJail from 27 - 29 June 2025 for Pentas Seni Johor x Paso Rakyat, a thriving collaborative event held by Yayasan JCorp in collaboration with Johor Bahru City Council and KotaJail to celebrate Johor's creative spirit. The initiative, which aimed to promote the cultural vibrancy of Johor, brought heritage and modern expression together while also empowering the local economy through arts, culture, and community-driven enterprise.

The event featured Malam Gembira Rakyat Jelata, an electrifying music segment with 7 local Johorean bands, namely Ramayan, Lasso, Shahrin & The Geng, B&D Acoustic, Akar Kayu, MRIP, and Arep JAWA. Following that, captivating cultural performances such as Gemalai Tari,

Kompong Asik, and Zapin Dance also dazzled the crowd with timeless traditions, encapsulating the richness and beauty of Johor's roots for visitors.

All attendees also experienced a bustling Artisan Market featuring 15 local entrepreneurs offering handmade crafts, with an additional 20 food vendors serving up nostalgic local dishes that added flavour to the festive atmosphere.

In total, the event successfully generated RM83,000 in sales, proving that the collective, yet diverse expression of arts and culture can play a key part in powering community-based economic growth.

SWM Environment Sdn Bhd, in collaboration with Yayasan JCorp and Majlis Daerah Mersing, hosted a game-changing Beach Clean-Up Programme on 19 June 2025 at Pantai Penyabong, Mersing, Johor.

Together with 120 volunteers from SWM Environment Sdn Bhd, Yayasan JCorp, Johor Plantations Group Berhad, Majlis Daerah Mersing, Wentel Engineering, JStar Motion, and the enthusiastic students of SK Penyabong, the programme successfully collected a total of 420kg of waste, including 170kg of recyclable items, marking a powerful effort in protecting Johor's coastlines and marine life.

In conjunction with the clean-up, the event also had a soft launch of the "Cabaran Botol Kaca Kitar Semula", which officially kicks off in July 2025 and will involve 60 schools across Johor. This competition was launched to encourage young minds to embrace the habit of recycling from an early age.

DRIVE THRU RECYCLE EVENT - OVER 1 TONNE OF RECYCLABLES COLLECTED

In conjunction with Komuniti Fest @ B5 Johor Street Market, Johor Bahru City Council, Yayasan JCorp, and SWM Environment Sdn Bhd successfully hosted the Drive Thru Recycle event, managing to collect over 1 tonne of recyclable items including e-waste to used fabrics, gathering materials like aluminum tins, glass, paper, plastics, and more.

To top it off, a special shoutout to Johor Specialist Hospital for offering free health screenings, blood donation services, and the impressive AI-powered eye health screening by Airdoc, proving that wellness and sustainability go hand in hand.



Additionally, with a smart collaboration with JLG Zaquin, the event managed to collect over 240kg of cooking oil to make other products, serving as a reminder that eco-friendly habits can also start in the kitchen.

This initiative supported MBBJ's mission toward a low-carbon, zero-waste future. With the help of participants, recyclers, and other contributors, everyone managed to take another step towards realizing that reality.

GROWING TOGETHER: TREES FOR SCHOOLS

In an ongoing effort to boost biodiversity around schools and foster a profound sense of environmental love amongst younger generations, Yayasan JCorp launched the 'Growing Together: Trees for Schools' programme on 26 June 2025 at Sungai Johor Eco Retreat (SUNJER), Basir Ismail Estate. This impactful initiative, which aims to provide students with hands-on learning and understanding regarding sustainability, was brought to life through a collaboration with Jabatan Pendidikan Negeri Johor (JPNJ), Pejabat Pendidikan Daerah (PPD) Kota Tinggi, and Johor Plantations Group, as part of the overarching 1MRFF initiative.

The launch was officiated by Encik Wan Adlin Wan Mahmood, Head of Commercial & Sustainability Division, JPG, and attended by Encik Mohd Jefferin bin Saat, Senior Assistant Director, School Management Sector, Johor State Education Department.

Additionally, an impactful tree planting activity at the 1MRFF site, as well as an engaging talk on Tree Planting & Climate Change by Dr. Nur Bahiyah binti Abdul Wahab, Lecturer at IPG Kampus Temenggong Ibrahim, was also held.

Prior to this, all participating schools attended both an online briefing, as well as a sustainability workshop on 25 June to ensure they were fully prepared.

The workshop aimed to equip students and teachers with practical knowledge of sustainability and tree planting, fostering environmental awareness and encouraging hands-on learning. This involved 3 sections, being 'Introduction to Sustainability' led by En. Mohd Radzi Muhamad Dul from JPG's Sustainability Division, 'Waste to Wealth' involving biocomposting facilitated by Dr. Huszalina Hussin, Senior Lecturer at the Department of Biosciences, UTM, and 'Biodiversity' in which Dr. Wong Ee Phin, Principal Investigator of Management & Ecology of Malaysian Elephants (MEME), introduced students to the role of Malaysian elephants in nature, the threats they face, and why it's important to protect biodiversity.

This vital support for the KPJ Johor Specialist Hospital specifically aids their Deep Brain Stimulation programme, aiming to improve neurological healthcare for those in need.

WALK A PAYUNG 2025: PURPLE SHADES FOR LUPUS AWARENESS

In a demonstration of support and unity for a vital cause, over 400 Johoreans joined the 'Walk A Payung 2025' event on World Lupus Day. Organised by Johor Specialist Hospital (JSH) in collaboration with the Johor Bahru City Council (MBJB), this approximately 5 km walk at the heart of Johor Bahru city aimed to raise crucial awareness about Systemic Lupus Erythematosus (SLE), a complex autoimmune disease, and to strengthen community solidarity in supporting and helping lupus patients.

In Malaysia, it is estimated that over 10,000 individuals have been diagnosed with SLE over the past 30 years, with a staggering 90% being women and 10% comprising men and children. Understanding this often-hidden illness is paramount. As a potent symbol of support, participants carried purple umbrellas, representing protection and awareness against Lupus and the sun's rays, which can often trigger symptoms. Beyond patients and their families donning purple attire, members of the public enthusiastically participated in solidarity, wearing purple to show their unwavering support for lupus patients.

The enthusiastic turnout and broad participation from the residents of Johor Bahru powerfully reflect the state's collective commitment to better understand and support those affected by this disease. Besides the invigorating walk, participants received an essential educational briefing on Lupus from Dr. Rachel Joshua Thudiyil, a Specialist in Internal Medicine and Rheumatology at Johor Specialist Hospital. Johor Specialist Hospital also offered free basic health screenings for all participants, actively encouraging early detection and promoting a better understanding of their health status within the community.

Yayasan JCorp and the Johor State Education Department (JPNJ) jointly conducted a workshop to review and refine the Booster B1 Module at Fives Hotel, Johor Bahru.

This workshop served as a continuation of the first session, building on the progress made earlier to further enhance and finalise the Booster B1 Module. Like before, 25 expert English teachers came together to contribute their insights and expertise towards improving the module, ensuring that the finalised module meets the highest standards of quality and effectiveness. With the collaborative efforts from all participating educators across these sessions, this module is optimally designed to help students boost their skills and confidence needed to excel in their English Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) examinations, being an effective and practical learning tool tailored to the students' needs.

This blended approach will provide students with a substantial head start in building the skills and confidence needed for real-world success.



Yayasan JCorp expanded its Akademi Dalam Industri (ADi) initiative into the healthcare sector in collaboration with KPJ Healthcare Berhad and the Department of Skills Development (JPK) Southern Region. Following its successful rollout in the F&B sector with QSR Stores Sdn Bhd, this newest expansion aims to equip students with professional healthcare skills, boosting their employability and future readiness. With strong collaboration between academic institutions and industry players, a focused, structured curriculum combining theory and hands-on training will be developed, with a comprehensive workshop recently being held at Menara KOMTAR JBCC, Johor Bahru, and led by JPK Southern Region with support from KPJ Bandar Dato' Onn Specialist Hospital, KPJ Healthcare College, Yayasan JCorp, and the Johor State Education Department (JPNJ).



Yayasan JCorp hosted a Focus Group Discussion with Johor State Education Department (JPNJ) and UiTM Shah Alam at Cerebrum, Menara KOMTAR, JBCC. This session served as a key platform to build an inclusive, impactful, and sustainable education framework for Johor's future, one that focused on strengthening core 3R skills (Reading, Writing, Arithmetic), addressed SPM student dropout issues, and expanded educational support to Orang Asli communities. Led by Associate Professor Dr. Norizan Jaafar from the Arshad Ayub Graduate Business School (AAGBS), UiTM Shah Alam, the session brought experts, partners, and stakeholders together to refine ideas and develop a strategic implementation module to be launched in 2026. Through initiatives like this, Yayasan JCorp works to establish a strong foundation for a more inclusive, responsive, and future-ready education system.



Yayasan JCorp and the Johor State Education Department welcomed delegates from the National Institute of Education (NIE), Singapore for a visit to select schools under the Sustainable School - STEM Programme. The visit served as a key step in preparing for the upcoming 2026 STEM Symposium, where educators will share insights and showcase innovative practices in sustainability and STEM education. Through continued collaboration and innovation, all parties will work to continue to empower and inspire tomorrow's generation.

This award acknowledged the meaningful collaboration between Yayasan JCorp and JLand Group to upgrade and uplift the Wad Iris Recreational Park, with the completed project now being a peaceful, tranquil healing space for over 200 cancer warriors undergoing radiotherapy at Hospital Sultan Ismail, Johor Bahru.



Yayasan JCorp contributed 600 KFC meal sets for attendees at the Program Komuniti Madani - Kenduri Rakyat 2025.

The programme was held at SK Sri Telok, Parit Yaani, Batu Pahat, attended by 600 people including school students, teachers and local community members. This programme centred around fostering a sense of love for Malaysia among participants, as well as cultivating an appreciation of diversity and a culture of respect between people of various races and religions, contributing to an atmosphere of cooperation and goodwill. The event also endeavoured to explore different cultures, presenting diverse customs, traditional foods and clothing of society in Malaysia.



Yayasan JCorp organised the Korban Kasih Programme at Surau As-Sholawatil Hikmah, Taman Desa Mutiara, Johor Bahru. Held in conjunction with Hari Raya Aidiladha, this programme strengthened community outreach. Yayasan JCorp contributed two cows for the korban ritual, benefiting 200 asnaf recipients from the surrounding community and bringing joy to their Aidiladha celebrations.



Yayasan JCorp joined forces with SWM Environment Sdn Bhd to deliver meaningful impact through the YOK! Bersih Pantai programme, in support of environmental preservation and community involvement. Set along the scenic Penyabong Waterfront, volunteers played a key role in this hands-on effort, not only contributing to a cleaner shoreline but also gaining first-hand experience in sustainable action. The programme also includes waste audit activities to enhance understanding of waste types and their impact on marine life, underscoring the importance of protecting coastal ecosystems while fostering a spirit of volunteerism.



Johor Bahru City Council in collaboration with SWM Environment Sdn Bhd and Yayasan JCorp organised a Drive-Thru Recycling Programme @ JB Komuniti Fest at B5 Johor Street Market, Johor Bahru. Among the items recycled are glass bottles, paper, PET bottles, fabric, iron, e-waste and also used cooking oil.



The Johor Art Stage was jointly organised by Yayasan JCorp and the Johor Bahru City Council in conjunction with the Komuniti Fest at B5 Johor Street Market, Johor Bahru. This initiative will be carried out in partnership with the community-driven group Tekan Tiga Creators and JB Muzika from the MBB team, who facilitated coordination and engagement with local artists.



Yayasan JCorp is proud to be one of the sponsors of the newly built Playground Site at NASOM Teluk Pulai Centre, Klang, together with DOW, NARC (UiTM-Autism Research Centre), and other partners. With plans beginning last December, the community came together to make this site a reality, with it now being a meaningful space for 44 autistic children aged 7 to 13 to play, grow, and thrive. The playground features a recycled foam surface made from used shoes, developed by DOW, providing a safer, low-carbon, water-based alternative to traditional rubber, perfect for enhancing sensory development while reducing injury risks.



The Growing Together Trees for Schools Programme was launched at Sungai Johor Eco Retreat (SUNJER), Basir Ismail Estate. This impactful initiative aimed to provide students with hands-on learning and understanding regarding sustainability matters, with 44 schools receiving a total of 6,938 plants, and 7,000 units of compost for them to take ownership of their green spaces. On top of this, an online briefing session and workshop was held to further cultivate practical knowledge of tree planting and environmental awareness.



Pentas Seni Johor x Paso Rakyat @KotaJail 2025, a collaboration with KotaJail, took place on 27 - 29 June 2025 at KotaJail, Johor Bahru. This strategic participation aligns with Yayasan JCorp's broader mission to preserve heritage, foster artistic expression, and encourage inclusive community engagement, all while also supporting KotaJail's dynamic transformation into a vibrant hub for arts, culture, and community spirit.
