Meanwhile, the Corporate Sector Arts Award was officiated by the Chairman of the Johor State Committee for Unity, Heritage, and Culture, YB Raven Kumar a/l Krishnasamy, with Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman also accepting the award on behalf of the foundation on 4 November 2025 at Hotel Opero, Johor Bahru.

Besides these groundbreaking wins, Yayasan JCorp would also like to congratulate KPJ Healthcare Berhad for winning the Platinum Special Award - Best Design Annual Report, a well-deserved achievement that Johor Corporation Group takes great pride in.

YAYASAN JCORP LAUNCHES DIGITAL LITERACY PROGRAMME FOR RURAL & B40 STUDENTS

Yayasan JCorp, in collaboration with the Johor State Education Department (JPNJ) and AFFIN Group, launched this programme on 27 October 2025 at SK Sayong Pinang, Kulai.

Themed “Building a Future-Ready Generation” and launched to bridge the digital divide for rural students from B40 families, this initiative involved three selected schools, namely SK Sikijang, SK Belokok, and SK Sayong Pinang (an Orang Asli community school), being provided with 20 laptops and an interactive smartboard each. The programme also introduced a digital literacy planning module that equips students with the essential 21st-century technology skills needed to adapt to today’s digital era.

The launch was officiated by YB Tuan Aznan Tamin, Chairman of the Johor State Education and Information Committee. Also present were Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman, Chief Executive Officer of Yayasan JCorp; Encik Zulkurnain Abdul Rahman, Deputy Director of Learning Sector, Johor State Education Department; and Puan Jozaimah Johan Ali, Managing Director of Strategy and Operations, AFFIN Group.

Additionally, the event also featured a gotong-royong activity involving teachers, parents, and the local community, symbolising unity and collective commitment towards holistic education development in Johor.

- Bridge the digital divide by providing access to technology and digital learning tools for students in rural and low-enrolment schools.
- Enhance digital literacy skills among primary school students to prepare them for the future.
- Empower B40 students through equitable access to resources that foster creativity, confidence, and technological proficiency.

- **60 laptops** and **three Interactive Smartboards** provided to three rural schools, creating interactive and engaging classrooms that enhance digital learning for students.
- **RM196,300** allocated for the Yayasan JCorp Digital Literacy Education programme in 2025.

REVIVING JOHOR'S WEAVING HERITAGE THROUGH PROJEK LEGASI JOHOR

Done in collaboration with the Johor Heritage Foundation, Yayasan JCorp launched Projek Legasi Johor to revitalise the heritage of Kain Benang Johor as an enduring symbol of identity, artistry, and cultural pride. Carrying the theme "Woven with Legacy, Worn with Identity", this initiative reflects Johor's commitment to honouring its cultural roots while embedding them within the next generation of talented artisans in their career path ahead.

Through this, ten selected participants of the Perintis Johor Intensive Basic Weaving Course received their official offer letters, with outstanding participants being selected to progress to advanced training at the National Craft Institute for Sijil Kemahiran Level 3 certification. Upon completion of their training, they may also be offered full-time positions as weavers under the Johor Heritage Foundation.

In line with the theme, the launch also featured prominent cultural performances, the unveiling of the Gambus motif, and a fashion presentation that reimagined traditional weaving motifs through modern design, demonstrating the natural evolution of heritage while maintaining pure authenticity.

- Preserve and revitalise the traditional weaving heritage of Johor.
- Train and develop new artisans equipped with foundational and advanced weaving skills.
- Encourage creative innovation through the reinterpretation of traditional motifs and contemporary design.
- Strengthen Johor's cultural ecosystem through collaboration, training facilities, and community-based heritage development.
- Position Johor as a centre for cultural heritage and sustainable creative craftsmanship.

OVER 107 TONNES OF GLASS COLLECTED THROUGH CABARAN KACA PUN BOLEH!



Programme Objectives

- Raise public awareness on glass recycling for sustainability and biodiversity.
- Engage schools, teachers, students, parents, and communities in green initiatives.
- Foster creativity and innovation through STEM and arts-based competitions.

Yayasan JCorp, alongside SWM Environment Sdn. Bhd. (SWM Environment) and with the support of strategic partners such as Johor Bahru City Council, Johor State Education Department, among others, organised the Cabaran Kaca Pun Boleh! recycling initiative to spur young environmental advocates towards meaningful action across Johor.

At the start, this programme targeted the collection of 30,000 kilograms of used glass bottles, spread across 60 participating primary schools around the state from July to November 2025. However, the initiative ended up surpassing prior projections and expectations, collecting a total of 107,202 kilograms of glass bottles within the four months. All collected materials were channelled for recycling under the KITARecycle programme, demonstrating the effectiveness of collective action driven by schools, communities and strategic partnerships.

SJK (C) Chung Hwa, Pontian emerged as the champion for the Anugerah Kutipan Kitar Semula Botol Kaca Tertinggi category, successfully collecting over 26,000 kilograms of glass bottles, while SK Parit Kudus, Pontian was the winner of the Anugerah Khas Sekolah Aspirasi category, receiving a cash prize of RM2,000 for its efforts in promoting environmental responsibility. Additionally, Encik Mohamad Azizi Illias, a teacher from SK Datuk Usman Awang, Kota Tinggi was also honoured with the Anugerah Khas Guru Harapan Lestari for his dedication to nurturing sustainability awareness among students.

POWERING AN OFF-GRID SCHOOL WITH A NEW SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEM

Yayasan JCorp contributed a Solar Photovoltaic System to Sekolah Agama Tunjuk Laut, one of Johor's few off-grid schools, under The Future Powered Project on 17 December 2025. The system was delivered in collaboration with Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), Majlis Agama Islam Negeri Johor (MAINJ), Johor Plantations Group Berhad (JPG) and strategic partner IJM Industry ICP Piles, serving to support the school's transition towards cleaner sustainable energy from reliance on traditional diesel generators.

Specifically, the newly installed Solar PV system has a capacity of 5.6 kilowatt peak kWp and comprises of nine solar panels, one GROWATT SPF 5000 ES inverter and four Lithium Iron Phosphate LFP batteries. This setup ensures efficient energy storage and a continuous electricity supply for uninterrupted learning - especially important for off-grid schools with limited infrastructural access. The system also comes equipped with Internet of Things IoT technology, empowering real-time energy monitoring to improve system reliability and long-term maintenance efficiency.

The handover ceremony was officiated by Tuan Haji Miswan Yunos, District Officer of Kota Tinggi. Also present were Puan Wan Su Ali, General Manager of Yayasan JCorp, Encik Shah Reza Md Kanafe, Senior Manager of Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor (YSIJ), and Associate Professor Ir. Dr. Shamsul Sarip, Deputy Director of UTM Campus Sustainability.

The Future Powered Project itself provided a collaborative platform for Yayasan JCorp's partners to channel their CSR efforts in support of the school. As a result of this project, Sekolah Agama Tunjuk Laut also received two Smart TVs, two printers, 200 chairs and whiteboards, back-to-school essentials, and 250 packed meals of KFC and Pizza Hut for students to enjoy.

Programme Objectives

Provide a renewable energy solution to ensure a stable electricity supply for an off-grid rural school.

Achieve a full transition from diesel to 100% solar energy for all classroom operational electricity needs.

Enhance teaching and learning continuity for 100+ students and teachers through uninterrupted power access.

Establish one scalable solar-powered education model for replication in other off-grid schools across Johor.



Programme Impacts

- **5.6 kWp** Solar PV system installed, generating clean energy for the school.
- **9 solar panels** and **4 LFP batteries** deployed to enable up to 24 hours of continuous electricity supply.
- **250 students** benefited from improved learning conditions supported by stable electricity and digital facilities.
- Over **450** items contributed, including Smart TVs, printers, chairs, whiteboards and student essentials.

WEATHERING THE STORM: STANDING WITH JOHOR'S ISLAND COMMUNITIES

For the second consecutive year, Yayasan JCorp, Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor, and the Mersing District Office joined forces to support Johor's Island communities - standing with them ahead of the upcoming monsoon season through the Monsoon Relief: Waves of Support initiative.

This year's programme reached a total of 235 families and students at Pulau Sibul, Pulau Tinggi, Pulau Besar, Pulau Pemanggil, and Pulau Aur, supporting beneficiaries with essentials such as hygiene kits, food supplies, cash assistance, and school vouchers. Spreading some cheer during the occasion, 16 students from SK Pulau Sibul also enjoyed an exciting back-to-school shopping trip at Hari Hari Supermarket and a special treat at KFC Mersing, bringing smiles to their faces as they prepared for the new school year.

These contributions were officially presented on 30 October 2025 at the Mersing District Office by Tuan Jamil Hasni Abdullah, District Officer of Mersing, alongside Encik Mohd Anizam bin Jamian, CEO of Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor, and Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman, CEO of Yayasan JCorp. Following this, both foundations also reaffirmed their commitment to galvanising the state's island residents with future efforts that nurture hope, bolster resiliency, and ultimately strengthen social development.

KPJ PASIR GUDANG CHAMPIONS HEALTH AND SUSTAINABILITY AT PULAU TANJUNG SURAT

Yayasan JCorp joined KPJ Pasir Gudang Specialist Hospital, Johor Plantations Group Berhad (JPG), and Pertubuhan Sahabat Hutan Bakau Pulau Tanjung Surat (PSHBTS) in a multifaceted initiative to promote environmental and community well-being, held at Pulau Tanjung Surat, Kota Tinggi, Johor on 11 December 2025.

Activities for the day included the planting of 500 mangrove trees as part of JPG's One Million Roots for the Future (1MRFF) campaign, bringing the total to 3,500 trees since the programme began in 2024. Following this, Yayasan JCorp visited SK Tanjung Surat, where they witnessed the impact of the smartboard TV donated earlier this year in transforming classrooms and enhancing digital learning for students.

Beyond these efforts, KPJ Pasir Gudang Specialist Hospital also conducted free health screenings for the local community, ensuring essential health checks and holistic, preemptive care for all participating residents. Through its involvement, KPJ Pasir Gudang Specialist Hospital demonstrated the vital role that healthcare plays as a foundation towards building healthier communities and lasting, sustainable futures.

Here's a snapshot of our key engagements and events from October to December 2025:



Yayasan JCorp conducted interview sessions to select participants for the Basic Weaving Intensive Course for Orang Muda Johor (OMJ), held at Galeri Tenun in collaboration with the Johor Heritage Foundation. This initiative is part of the Kain Benang Johor Heritage Preservation Programme, which aims to revitalise the traditional weaving industry by nurturing, training, and inspiring young artisans to carry forward Johor's rich textile heritage. Following these sessions, 10 participants were selected to undergo a six-month structured training programme from 15 October 2025 to 15 April 2026, offering hands-on learning, mentorship, and skill-building in traditional weaving techniques.

Yayasan JCorp held Skill Workshops for Retirees (Basic Electrical Wiring & Air Conditioning Servicing & Maintenance Workshop) at the Johor Skills Development Centre, Pasir Gudang. Led by Encik Muhammad Nur Azfar bin Noh, Training Coordinator of Johor Skills and Encik Kamaruzaman bin Mohd Salleh, Senior Director of CIDB Southern Region (Electrical Wiring), and Encik Mohamad Azizi bin Samsudin, Certified Aircond Trainer (Aircon servicing), these workshops equipped 50 retirees from PERHEBAT Johor with the knowledge and hands-on skills needed to support independent and confident living. Beyond that, it also enhanced their electrical/appliance knowledge in daily life and encouraged continuous personal skills growth even past retirement.

The Early Detection and Occupational Therapy Screening Programme was held in collaboration with the Johor State Education Department and Mindcare Therapy Centre. Organised in line with Yayasan JCorp's ongoing commitment to supporting mental health and developmental needs amongst the youth, this programme screened 203 students from 21 primary schools across Johor, focusing on key developmental areas such as attention and focus, motor skills, visual perception, emotional regulation, and daily living activities (ADL). Additionally, an awareness session was also held for teachers to deepen their understanding of students' developmental progress and needs.



As part of JPG Green Fun Run, Yayasan JCorp contributed a total of RM50,000 to 25 people with disabilities across five dedicated welfare organisations, namely the Kelab Bandar Kita Johor Bahru, Persatuan Cerebral Palsy Johor, Persatuan Kanak-kanak Autistik Islam Johor Bahru, Persatuan Sindrom Down Johor, and Pertubuhan Kebajikan dan Sokongan OKU Johor Bahru. With the help of 20 JSkills and KPJ Healthcare College Johor Bahru volunteers, the event itself involved a 1KM Fun Run Special category at the Sungai Johor Eco Retreat followed by a tree-planting session with Kundang, Quinny, and Tampoi trees, which supported JPG's One Million Roots for the Future campaign.



Yayasan JCorp visited Dapur Digital PPR Beringin, an enterprising initiative by Pepper Labs to help B40 entrepreneurs generate daily income, enhance digital skills, and build community-driven economic hubs. Initially established in 2022 and led by Puan Maznah, every order made through Dapur Digital actively serves to shape resilient, inclusive, and self-sustaining communities, all in support of the Malaysia MADANI mission. This visit helped Yayasan JCorp to gain deeper insights into how the model empowers B40 entrepreneurs while also opening up avenues of discussion and collaborative opportunities for future community empowerment programmes.

Done in conjunction with Laksamana Run 2025, the mock cheque presentation was presented by Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman, Chief Executive Officer of Yayasan JCorp, to YAM Tunku Tun Aminah Binti Sultan Ibrahim, Royal Patron of the Laksamana Run, during the Mock Cheque Presentation and Flag-Off Ceremony at Gateway Garden, Bandar Medini Iskandar.



Yayasan JCorp participated in the Wonderful Nusantara Festival, a cultural initiative by Yayasan Warisan Johor to promote Visit Johor Year 2026 as well as celebrate the shared heritage of the Nusantara. The event saw the participation of four countries: Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia, and Thailand.



Yayasan JCorp contributed RM20,000 in support of Karnival Mahabbah 2025, a cultural and community festival held by Waqaf An-Nur. With both companies being JCorp's dedicated philanthropic institutions, this contribution falls under the shared purpose of both organisations to nurture compassion, unity, and a love for cultural expression within the community. The mock cheque was presented by Encik Shahrazali Sahlan, Manager of Yayasan JCorp, to Tuan Haji Bukhari Abd Rahman, Chief Executive Officer of Waqaf An-Nur. In addition, Art Root Studio, a local talent nurtured under Pentas Seni Johor, conducted interactive art workshops for over 200 visitors throughout the four-day carnival, reflecting a robust, growing public interest in local arts.



The Digital Literacy Programme was launched at SK Sayong Pinang, Kulai, as a pilot project. Three low-enrolment schools, namely SK Sikijang, SK Belokok and SK Sayong Pinang (an Orang Asli community school), were selected to participate. All participating schools were provided digital learning resources such as laptops and Smartboards, bridging technological access and opportunities for children in rural schools, especially those from B40 families.



Yayasan JCorp contributed RM57,000 in prizes to support the National Language Unity Programme 2025 at the Lotus Desaru Beach Resort, which brought together over 1,500 students from 752 contingents nationwide through language-based competitions. This programme acts as a platform that combines learning and creativity, allowing students to gain confidence, expressiveness, and innovative thinking beyond just honing their language skills. The Johor contingent achieved remarkable success during the event, winning multiple podiums as well as the grand prize for Public Speaking (Secondary), Dare to Spell (Primary), and Storytelling (SJK) categories. Notably, the closing ceremony was graced by YB Wong Kah Woh, Deputy Minister of Education Malaysia, alongside YB Tuan Aznan Tamin, Johor State Executive Council Member for Education and Information; Tuan Haji Mohd Hanafi Samad, Director of the Johor State Education Department; and Puan Wan Su Ali, General Manager of Yayasan JCorp.

Bhd., the sessions provided 30 Form 2 and 3 students for each school, as well as corresponding teachers and officers from the Johor Bahru District Education Office, with practical exposure to greenhouse processes such as seed germination, greenhouse irrigation systems, and IoT-based smart farming operations. This greenhouse project is part of Yayasan JCorp's ongoing initiative to nurture innovation and sustainability among the younger generation.



The second Monsoon Relief: Waves of Support initiative was held at the Mersing District Office in collaboration with Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor, which aimed to aid communities around Johor's islands or other flood-prone areas during the monsoon period - ensuring that no one gets left behind in times of need.



Yayasan JCorp's CEO and JCorp's Chief Sustainability & Social Impact Officer, Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman, served as a key panellist for the session "Measuring ESG Impact in Higher Education: Bridging Practice, Policy & Metrics", held in conjunction with the International Sustainability Summit 2025 (ISS2025) at the Sunway Big Box Hotel. The discussions explored how sustainability and ESG principles can be integrated into institutional frameworks to shape long-term, measurable change across sectors. Notably, Yayasan JCorp's role as the social and sustainability driver within the JCorp ecosystem was emphasised during the session, anchoring its ESG approach in understanding community realities and addressing systemic needs rather than executing short-term initiatives.



Yayasan JCorp took part in the Johor STEM Mini Theatre Programme at Southern University College, Johor Bahru, which was organised by the National STEM Association (NSA). During the session, Cik Sharifah Hasyimah Syed Mohd Nazar shared Yayasan JCorp's recent activities towards nurturing innovation and future-ready skills amongst the next generation, including the Smart Farming Green House developed together with corporate partners and the Digital Literacy Programme, which focused on providing technological accessibility and opportunities for rural students, B40 communities and schools with low enrolment. Through participation in this programme, Yayasan JCorp hopes to explore potential future collaborations with corporate agencies and partners to expand access to quality STEM learning and create more hands-on, real-world experiences for students across Johor.



Yayasan JCorp held an engagement session with scholars under the ACCA Sponsorship Programme at TYMByte Learning Centre, Kuala Lumpur. The session itself involved six scholars, comprising five Post-SPM and one Post-Degree scholar, sharing progress updates, discussing challenges faced, and outlining plans - all in preparation for the upcoming exam cycle. The session was attended by Puan Noor Zarina Mohammad Noor, Chief Operating Officer of MyPAC, together with representatives from Yayasan JCorp. With the programme being tailored towards developing scholars into young professionals, 2 scholars have successfully completed the programme as of writing and are now employed as professional accountants at KLI International and the APPGM-SDG Secretariat, respectively.



Johor Corporation and Yayasan JCorp showcased various green initiatives contributing to Johor's sustainability ecosystem, in conjunction with the launch of Johor's Green Development Policy (PPHJ) at TMIYC. During the event, Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman represented JCorp and Yayasan JCorp to share key programmes and environmental efforts, demonstrating how these entities shape long-term impact across the state across its four key pillars. The ceremony was graced by KDYMM Seri Paduka Baginda Raja Permaisuri Agong, Raja Zarith Sofiah, with YAM Che' Puan Mahkota Khaleeda Johor also in attendance.



Yayasan JCorp hosted the Closing Ceremony & Prize Presentation of the Cabaran Kaca Pun Boleh! Initiative at Dewan Jubli Intan, Johor Bahru. The ceremony was officiated by Dr Hajah Aslinda binti Salkin, Director of the Health Department, Johor Bahru City Council, and was graced with the attendance of Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman, Chief Executive Officer of Yayasan JCorp, and Encik Norlisam Mohd Nordin, Corporate General Manager of SWM Environment.



Yayasan JCorp and the Johor Heritage Foundation launched the Johor Legacy Project - an initiative to ensure that the state's traditional Kain Benang Johor weaving art continues to thrive, evolve, and be passed down to future generations. Themed "Weaving Legacy, Wearing Identity", this project aims to produce skilled young weavers who can elevate Kain Benang Johor as a core element of the state's identity. The launch ceremony was officiated by YBhg. Encik Mohd Masni Wakiman, Johor Bahru District Officer, at the Sultan Abu Bakar Heritage Complex, Johor Bahru.



Johor Plantations Group Berhad (JPG) planted 500 mangrove trees at Pulau Tanjung Surat, Kota Tinggi in collaboration with Yayasan JCorp, KPJ Pasir Gudang Specialist Hospital and Pertubuhan Sahabat Hutan Bakau Pulau Tanjung Surat (PSHBTS). This marks Yayasan JCorp's third visit to the island, bringing the total number of mangroves planted to 3,500 as part of JPG's One Million Roots for the Future (1MRFF) campaign, which aims to plant over one million trees to restore and protect the environment.



Yayasan JCorp contributes Solar Photovoltaic System facilities to Sekolah Agama (SA) Tunjuk Laut. This donation was part of Yayasan JCorp's 'The Future Powered Project', a solar energy project held in collaboration with Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), Majlis Agama Islam Negeri Johor (MAINJ), Johor Plantations Group Berhad (JPG) and strategic partner IJM Industry ICP Piles. With sustainable energy at the helm, this programme provides rural off-grid schools with better electricity facilities, upgrading from the use of diesel-powered generators.
