## BY OUR PEOPLE'S SIDE: SUPPORTING COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT RAMADAN AND SYAWAL 2025



Throughout Ramadan, Yayasan JCorp and dedicated JCorp Group volunteers - including QSR Brands, KPJ Healthcare Berhad, and Farmbyte Sdn Bhd - rallied to support vulnerable families and the elderly through community outreach programmes and financial assistance. Contributions included 250 KFC meal sets, 100 hygiene kits, and bottled pineapple juice, alongside a group-wide donation and volunteerism campaign.

In a first-of-its-kind initiative for Yayasan JCorp, 737 pairs of Baju Raya were donated to asnaf families and those in need, sourced through contributions from JCorp Group employees and members of the public. This heartfelt gesture reflected the spirit of communal generosity that Yayasan JCorp seeks to foster across Johor.

Yayasan JCorp also contributed 100 packs of essential dry food aid at the Majlis Iftar Perdana & Nuzul Al-Quran Bersama Asnaf at Masjid An-Nur, Taman Cendana, Pasir Gudang, ensuring that underserved communities could observe the sacred occasion with dignity and sustenance.

Additionally, Yayasan JCorp contributed RM20,000 in support of the Prihatin Syawal programme, further demonstrating the foundation's holistic approach to supporting underprivileged communities during the festive season - addressing both immediate material needs and fostering a sense of social connection and care.

### CELEBRATING COMPASSION AND COMMUNITY



**During Hari Raya Aidilfitri and Hari Raya Aidiladha, Yayasan JCorp embraced the true meaning of fellowship through events that highlighted the spirit of giving.**

The #CaraKiter JCorp Group Aidilfitri Open House 2025 on 15 April at Persada Johor, Yayasan JCorp welcomed 30 special guests - including orphaned children, individuals with Down syndrome, and senior citizens - as honoured participants in the celebrations. A total of RM40,000 in contributions was extended to Pertubuhan Kebajikan Anak-Anak Yatim Johor (RUMAH BARKAT), Persatuan Sindrom Down Negeri Johor, Pusat Jagaan Impian Syimah, Pusat Jagaan Warga Emas Nur Ehsan and KPJ Johor Specialist Hospital, with the latter specifically supporting the hospital's Deep Brain Stimulation programme for neurological healthcare improvement.

For Hari Raya Aidiladha, the Korban Kasih Programme was held on 8 June 2025 at Surau As-Sholawatil Hikmah, Taman Desa Mutiara, Johor Bahru. Through this programme, Yayasan JCorp made its inaugural contribution of two cows for the korban ritual, benefiting low income asnaf families from the surrounding community. The initiative reflected a commitment to strengthening social compassion, unity, and the spirit of sacrifice within the community.

These programmes served to foster closer community ties and encourage a culture of mutual support towards building a more inclusive and sustainable society.

- ▶ Offer a meaningful and joyful Raya celebration for orphans, the elderly, and individuals with disabilities.
- ▶ Distribute Duit Raya and cash contribution aid to guests from orphanages, elderly homes, and disability centres.
- ▶ Fulfil the religious obligation of Ibadah Korban in accordance with Islamic principles.

### Programme Impacts

- ▶ **RM3,000** donated directly to orphans, individuals with Down syndrome, and senior citizens.
- ▶ **RM40,000** donated to RUMAH BARKAT, Persatuan Sindrom Down Negeri Johor, and KPJ Johor Specialist.
- ▶ Fresh korban meat from 2 cows, costing **RM10,400**, distributed to 200 asnaf families.
- ▶ A cumulative total of **RM103,000** has been donated in conjunction with the JCorp Group's Aidilfitri celebration from 2022 to 2025, reflecting sustained commitment.
- ▶ More than **3,500** guests attended the event.

## YAYASAN JCorp's SKILLS WORKSHOPS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES AND RETIREES



**In partnership with Pertubuhan Keselamatan Sosial (PERKESO) and Johor Skills Development Centre (JSkills), Yayasan JCorp assisted people with disabilities in returning to the workforce, both connecting them with suitable jobs and providing the necessary tools they need to secure new positions in line with their abilities and interests.**

Specially curated training modules were tailored to accommodate diverse physical, sensory, and mental abilities, building practical competencies, communication skills, and workplace readiness. The programme offered two courses: a Housekeeping Operations course (21-25 July 2025) and a Hygiene Operations course (25-29 August 2025), each welcoming 15 participants at the Johor Skills Development Centre, Pasir Gudang. This programme ultimately promotes inclusion and improves societal perceptions of people with disabilities in the workforce.

Extending its commitment to lifelong empowerment, Yayasan JCorp also conducted Skills Workshops for Retirees, covering Basic Electrical Wiring (22 September-3 October 2025) and Air Conditioning Servicing & Maintenance (22-27 October 2025) - at the Johor Skills Development Centre, Pasir Gudang. Organised in collaboration with PERHEBAT Johor, these workshops equipped 50 retirees with hands-on technical skills to support independent and confident living beyond retirement. Sessions were led by specialist trainers including Encik Muhammad Nur Azfar bin Noh (Training Coordinator, Johor Skills), Encik Kamaruzaman bin Mohd Salleh (Senior Director, CIDB Southern Region), and Encik Mohamad Azizi bin Samsudin (Certified Air Conditioning Trainer). Beyond acquiring new skills, participants were empowered to enhance their electrical and appliance knowledge in daily life, and encouraged towards continuous personal growth.

### WEATHERING THE STORM: STANDING WITH JOHOR'S ISLAND COMMUNITIES



For the second consecutive year, Yayasan JCorp, Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor, and the Mersing District Office delivered pre-monsoon relief to 180 families and students across five of Johor's island communities - Pulau Sibul, Pulau Tinggi, Pulau Besar, Pulau Pemanggil, and Pulau Aur. Support packages included hygiene kits, food supplies, cash assistance, and school vouchers.

Sixteen students from SK Pulau Sibul also enjoyed an exciting back-to-school shopping trip at Hari Hari Supermarket and a special treat at KFC Mersing, bringing smiles to their faces as they prepared for the new school year. Both foundations reaffirmed their commitment to galvanising the state's island residents with future efforts that nurture hope, bolster resilience, and ultimately strengthen social development.

## TOWARDS AN INCLUSIVE JOHOR: SUPPORTING NEURODIVERSITY AND DISABLED COMMUNITIES



**Yayasan JCorp strengthened its commitment to autism awareness, early intervention, and inclusive community support through a series of key initiatives in 2025.**

On 24 June, Yayasan JCorp joined National Autism Society of Malaysia (NASOM) and strategic partners Dow, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) and National Autism Resource Centre (NARC) to inaugurate a new playground at NASOM Teluk Pulai - funded through the Eco Run for Inclusion 2024. The facility provides a safer, more nurturing environment for children with autism to play, learn, and develop essential motor and social skills.

Yayasan JCorp also continued its long-standing support for children with cerebral palsy. On 16 and 17 May 2025, the foundation participated in the Pasar Ria Charity Bazaar organised by Cerebral Palsy Johor Association (CPJ), contributing RM10,000 worth of sales coupons to help raise funds for the association's daily operations and student welfare.

From 29 September to 13 October, Yayasan JCorp collaborated with Johor State Education Department and Mindcare Therapy Centre to deliver an Early Detection and Occupational Therapy Screening Programme for 203 students across 20 primary schools. The initiative focused on early identification of developmental needs including attention, motor skills, visual perception, emotional regulation, and daily living skills, supported by an awareness session to help teachers better understand and support their students.

Yayasan JCorp also extended its reach to persons with physical disabilities. In conjunction with the JPG Green Fun Run on 4 October 2025 at Sungai Johor Eco Retreat, Yayasan JCorp contributed RM50,000 across five dedicated welfare organisations - Kelab Bandar Kita Johor Bahru, Persatuan Cerebral Palsy Johor, Persatuan Kanak-kanak Autistik Islam Johor Bahru, Persatuan Sindrom Down Johor, and Pertubuhan Kebajikan dan Sokongan OKU Johor Bahru - ensuring that 25 individuals with disabilities directly benefited from the contribution.

Through these ongoing efforts, Yayasan JCorp strengthens partnerships between educators, parents, and health professionals - building a more inclusive, compassionate Johor where every child and community member has the chance to thrive.

- ▶ **RM50,000** was contributed to five welfare organisations supporting persons with disabilities, directly benefiting **25** individuals, in conjunction with the JPG Green Fun Run.
- ▶ Since 2021, nearly **RM600,000** has been channelled by Yayasan JCorp to Persatuan Cerebral Palsy Johor to support its ongoing programmes.

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### SUPPORTING HEALTH-RELATED CAUSES: CANCER AWARENESS AND PATIENT CARE



**Yayasan JCorp has maintained a steadfast commitment to supporting cancer patients and their families through consistent and meaningful contributions to the Tunku Laksamana Johor Cancer Foundation (TLJCF).**

On 18 July 2025, in conjunction with the Symphony for Hope: A Decade of Compassion charity dinner and concert at the Permaisuri Zarith Sofea Opera House, Johor Bahru, Yayasan JCorp contributed RM100,000 to TLJCF, presented by Encik Rozaini Mohd Sani, Chairman of Yayasan JCorp, to TLJCF Board Member, YB Dato' Ismail Karim.

Subsequently, on 18 October 2025, Yayasan JCorp contributed a further RM70,000 to TLJCF in conjunction with the Laksamana Run 2025. The mock cheque was presented by Puan Zaidatul Zurita Abdul Rahman, Chief Executive Officer of Yayasan JCorp, to YAM Tunku Tun Aminah Binti Sultan Ibrahim, Royal Patron of the Laksamana Run, during the Flag-Off Ceremony at Gateway Garden, Bandar Medini Iskandar.

Earlier in the year, Yayasan JCorp also donated 230 sets of KFC meals to participants of the Cancer Awayday 2025 Programme, providing a warm gesture of care and solidarity to cancer patients and their caregivers during what can be a challenging journey.

These sustained contributions reflect Yayasan JCorp's belief that community well-being encompasses not only social and economic empowerment, but also compassionate support for those navigating serious illness.
